

LTC Kendric H. Robbins has held various leadership and staff positions in armor and mechanized infantry units during his seventeen year military career. His prior deployments and assignments include serving as a State Department Fellow in the office of the Coordinator for Reconstruction and Stabilization and as a White House Fellow where he was a Special Assistant to the Director of the U.S. Office of Personnel Management. From 2008-2009 he was the Executive Officer and Operations Officer of Task Force 2-6 Infantry, 2<sup>nd</sup> Brigade, 1<sup>st</sup> Armored Division where he took part in OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM. From 2004-2007 he served as an Assistant Professor and Executive Officer in the Department of Social Sciences at West Point. From 1998-2002 he was the Commander of the Regimental Headquarters Troop, 3<sup>rd</sup> Armored Cavalry Regiment and Commander of K Troop, 3<sup>rd</sup> Armored Cavalry Regiment as part of the NATO Stabilization Force (SFOR) in Bosnia. From 1994-1997 he served as a Platoon Leader and Executive Officer in 2-63 Armor, 3<sup>rd</sup> Brigade, 1<sup>st</sup> Infantry Division which included a deployment as part of the United Nations Preventative Deployment Force (UNPREDEP) in the Former Yugoslavia Republic of Macedonia.
