

Lieutenant Colonel Andrew Green graduated from Seattle University and was commissioned as an Armor officer in June 1989. After graduation from Ranger School, his first duty assignment was in the 1st Battalion, 69th Armor, where he served as a Tank Platoon Leader in Kitzingen, Germany. He was reassigned to 2nd Battalion, 70th Armor in Erlangen, Germany where he served as a Tank Platoon Leader, Company Executive Officer and Battalion Adjutant. In July 1994, after completing the Armor Officer Advanced Course, Lieutenant Colonel Green commanded a Recruiting Company in Manhattan, Kansas. In 1996, he graduated from Airborne School and served as the Battalion Adjutant and then commanded HHC, 1-64 Armor, 3rd Infantry Division at Fort Stewart, Georgia.

In May 1998, Lieutenant Colonel Green served as the Chief of Operations for 4/87 Training Support Brigade in Fort Stewart, Georgia and then served in June 2001, as the Brigade S4 to the 1st Brigade of the 2nd Infantry Division, in Tonguchon, South Korea. He completed Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas in the summer of 2003. Immediately following, Lieutenant Colonel Green reported to the 1st Cavalry Division in Fort Hood, Texas, where he served as the Executive Officer of 1st Battalion, 12th Cavalry Regiment, deploying in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom 2 from February 2004 to March 2005.

Upon his redeployment from Iraq, Lieutenant Colonel Green returned to Germany serving as the Knowledge Development Branch Chief, Joint Planner and then Executive Officer for the Command Interagency Engagement Group in HQ USEUCOM, Stuttgart Germany. In 2008, he then became the Executive Officer for the Chief of Staff for NATO Allied Land Component Command Heidelberg, Germany. He served in this position until January 2010.

His awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, the Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, the Army Achievement Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Combat Action Badge, Ranger Tab, Parachutist Badge and Recruiter Badge.
